

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES
February 16, 1990
Brentwood Recreational Center

CALL TO ORDER: By President Bud Leistner at 8:27 p.m.

ROLL CALL: All Board Members and Officers were present.

Alice Krueger moved that we dispense with the regular business until after the Royal Hecht Awards. Daphne Szczuka second. Motion passed.

Fran Foster presented the awards and commented that the Royal Hecht awards were started many years ago in 1972 by Mr. Hecht. The Bred by Exhibitor award was the only award. The purpose of the award was to encourage people to show their own breeding. The award mushroomed to include obedience and other title holders. There is a special award for ROM's, an award we don't give out often because there are only a few dogs that achieve ROM. With the original breed by award the point system was 4 points if the dog was 1st in its class; 3 points if the dog was second in its class; 2 points if the dog was third in its class and 1 point if the dog placed fourth. Now the number of points is based on the number of dogs the dog defeated in its class. The awards were as follows:

Ricky Harrison mentioned that two club members—Lori Schwartzbeck and Karen Hynek had dogs that went best in futurity and that this should be recognized. Fran agreed. Fran also mentioned that it wasn't fair that the HIC award was the same as the CD award and suggested that Bud set up a committee to make some changes.

The minutes of January 19, 1990 were approved as read. The board meeting minutes of February 2, 1990 were read.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

TREASURER

Don Krueger read the treasurer report for January 1, 1990—January 30, 1990 and it was filed for audit.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY

AUDITOR

Barb Bronson reported that the treasurer and training committee

TRAINING

Harold reported that the obedience classes were in their 6th week and that the puppy class was in its 5th week. The club got a free advertisement. Channel 2 came down and filmed the club. There's one more week of puppy kindergarten, then we will have 3 weeks of confirmation class.

SPRING SHOW

Need chairman for the puppy match, and also need someone to transport the judge from the airport and to and from the show site. AKC approved the judges panel. Charlie volunteered to pick up the judge Ken Cunningham has been working with the Central Illinois Shepherd Club and has asked if we could advertise their puppy match in our premium list. Members suggested that AKC doesn't allow this. Nancy suggested putting it in the Wag-n-Tongue as a courtesy. She also reported that the Canine Corp is interested in a faster program where people could donate puppies that could later serve in the corp after they had matured and been trained.

OLD BUSINESS

Alice Krueger volunteered to sit on the by-law committee.

Ken Cunningham said he would conduct the confirmation class. There is a fifteen dog maximum.

Fran Foster moved that the decision of whether to print parent club information be the Wag-n-Tongue editor. Second: Nancy. Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

Bud Lester welcomed Lloyd Mauldin and Mark Wulfmeir as new members and also welcomed the guests.

Alice Krueger mentioned that there are breed-specific laws in many communities and that our breed is on the endangered list. There was a motion to donate \$150.00 to the Canine Defense Fund. Helene seconded. AKC will match any funds donated to ADFA. Motion passed. Nancy moved that we renew our membership with ADFA. Alan Rooney seconded. Motion passed.

Ricky Harrison asked when did we get our non-profit status back. Bud explained that we have not-for-profit status. Now we can make money but we must make charitable contributions to maintain the status.

Nancy motioned that we donate \$25.00 to the Law Enforcement's Officers Memorial Fund in the Canine Corp's name. Fran seconded. Larry Duerbeck asked for a specific explanation for the memorial. Barb Bronson explained that the memorial would be in Washington, D.C. and that it was to recognize officers. Larry Duerbeck opposed the motion. Motion passed.

Barb Bronson will give a war dogs educational program at the dog museum from 1-4 on May 27th. The film will be shown about 2:00.

Adopt-a-Highway: Harold reported that it involves lawnmowing, beautification, and litter pickup four times per year. They supply the bags and the contract can terminate at anytime. However, they would like a 3-year commitment. Asked for volunteer. Don Bridges volunteered. Marilyn suggested a show of hands by those who would participate. We're going to place it in the Wag-n-Tongue and those interested can mail in the response sheet.

Larry Duerbeck mentioned there's a new mutant strain of Parvo from Kansas City. Current vaccines don't protect against it. Fort Dodge sells the vaccine--K-Fil.

Bud mentioned that he would like to give away free raffle tickets to set rid of the old flea collars and vitamins. Helene suggested selling the mugs left over from ways and means last year.

The club received a letter that the certificate of deposit matures on February 28, 1990 and that it would automatically renew itself. The penalty for withdrawal is 1 month simple interest regardless of whether its earned or not. Helene mentioned that we add \$1,000 to the present account. Marilyn seconded. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

Alan suggested that we should have novice and conditioning classes for people who have been through the novice class or who otherwise have more experience showing dogs and just want to condition. Harold suggested that we could maybe rent the gym for an extra hour. Charlie and Bud stated that obedience has to come first. Alan suggested that we might want to get with other clubs and raise money for a Dog Fanciers Park. It has been done before and has been successful.

ASK DR. RUTH ■ Late-Night Advice from Dr. Ruth Weimaraner

Dr. Ruth, I'm a purebred who's won several prizes at dog shows, and I'm trying to have puppies. Unfortunately, because of my show record, my owners see my puppies as potential sources of profit. They're planning to select my mate on the basis of his heritage, and I have absolutely no say in the matter. Our criteria are completely different—they want a champion with perfect coloring and great posture, and I want someone sensitive and caring. He could be a mutt, for all I care. What should I do?

Well, the first thing that I would like to make absolutely clear is that you do not have to have puppies with any dog you dislike. You can always make it perfectly obvious to your owners and to the dog in question that you have no interest in him, and your owners will eventually give up or try another dog. So you do at least have a negative voice in what's going on.

The second point I would like to make is that it's important to give each dog a fair chance. Admittedly, you may not have all the time you'd like to get to know him, but don't assume you won't like him. Being a champion doesn't automatically make a dog a bad lover or an insensitive beast. After all, you seem nice enough, and you've won prizes. Humans have a saying: "It's just as easy to fall in love with a rich man as a poor man." I propose that we modify that saying to read: "It's just as easy to fall in love with a purebred as a mutt."

Next, consider how he feels. You're not the only one being put in an awkward situation. He's probably just as nervous as you are, and being honest about your feelings may put you both at ease.

Lastly, it's a good idea to think of the puppies themselves. If your owners are going to a great deal of effort to find you a suitable mate, they're also planning to find good homes for the puppies. If, instead, you find yourself a mutt—who may be a perfectly nice dog—your people may not feel so responsible for the puppies, and it may be much harder to find homes for them.

Dr. Ruth, I have to admit something. I've been doing it doggy-style all my life, and it's getting pretty dull. Aren't there any other positions?

Oh, my, yes. Humans have been experimenting with them for centuries. But I think you'd better not try them. They're almost all logically impossible for canines. If you want to add some excitement to your sex life, there are better ways to do it than by requiring the services of a chiropractor.

Dr. Ruth, my owner yells at me whenever I lick myself, especially in front of guests. Doesn't he know that I'm just trying to keep myself clean?

Attempting to impose human mores on dogs is a sign of gross immaturity. Bark at him the next time he powders himself for jock itch. See how he likes it.
