Whenever there was a job to do, or a position to be elected to, or a meeting to attend, one name was always on everyone's lips.....


"Let Someone Else do it!"

PARENT CLUB REPORTS FOR REGIONAL CLUBS

Release #187 November 1, 1988 Service Dogs, Cont.last rpt. Erich Renner, Chps.

Just to inform you about the SV trial held the same day: The 1987 SV Schutzhund-Champion was Helmut Huber with his 6 year old bitch Bona vom Waldwinkel SchH 3, FH. His scores: A - 100 points, B - 99 points and C - 99 points, a total of 298. Second place went to Franz Jankowiak with his also 6 year old bitch Minett vom Haus Anja SchH 3, FH, IP 3. Of the 91 participants, 45 earned the highest score: Excellent. 24 placed Very Good and 14 scored a Good. 6 teams were only satisfactory and only one unsatisfactory.

Mr. Georg Dietrich, one of the trial judges, wrote in his critique

(and this seems to be of utmost importance):

"I was especially impressed by the many dogs in that Championship trial who not only performed with excellence but possess an excellent STRUCTURE. The presence of German Shepherd Dogs with outstanding working ability and excellent conformation underlines the decision of the SV that in the future only those dogs qualified for breeding can be entered."

The SV - with this decision to upgrade the structural qualities of Working Dogs - demonstrated clearly the aim which the "father" of the breed has said over and over again: "Utility and Beauty are equally

necessary for a German Shepherd, a total German Shepherd Dog."

I would like to direct your attention to the fact that among the 91 entries of the SV Trial, ELEVEN Bitches performed with excellent results. As a matter of fact the Victrix and the second place were both bitches. Mr. Heinz Glück, the National Training Director of the SV, pointed out that last year and again in 1987 the participating bitches did exceptionally well. A fact every member should pay attention to since it seems to be widely believed that females are less aggressive and softer than their male counterpart.

For club members who are interested in Search and Rescue dogs, especially in training German Shepherd Dogs for avalanche work: The German Search and Rescue organization (DRB) St. Georg club, extends an invitation to us. A blind attorney in Los Angeles was refused service in one of our

finest Hotels - THE BILTMORE-. Reason: She is using a Guide Dog.

This time the Hotel management picked on the wrong person. The lady sued and would have won in court. In addition to other laws prohibiting discrimination, the California Business and Professional Code allows liquor licenses to be restricted or even revoked because of sex-, race-, or handicapped discrimination. The two parties however came to an agreement to defuse what could have been a long and expensive lawsuit.

The manager who refused service does not work at the Biltmore anymore and the Hotel hosted a morning seminar with breakfast for more than 150 (one hundred and fifty) Hoteliers and Restauranteurs and no less an

an authority than California Attorney General John K. Van de Kamp detailed for them the laws on handicapped rights.

If you would know how humiliating it is for a blind person with a Guide Dog to have some manager of some establishment tell you that you won't

be served, you would feel as great about this story as I do.

Usually I am absolutely not in favor of more and more laws being passed by the legislature but there is one new law in California I supported

wholeheartedly.

Effective New Years Day it is illegal to haul a dog in back of a pick up truck without an adequate restraint. Nationwide some 100,000 dogs were flung from truck beds and killed last year, according to Mr. Edward Cubrda, the Director of the Los Angeles Society for the Prevention of Cruelto to Animals. Please support similar laws in your State to prevent injury and even death not only to animals but also people because when these poor dogs fall off, traffic accidents are the results.

Again I would like to take this opportunity to ask the members of the Board and the general membership to send news stories about German Shepherd

Dear Friends of the four-legged Soldier,

Most of you are aware of the fact that I often time my correspondence to you around some holiday, and this newsletter fits that timing. If all goes well, you should be getting this on, or before, Veteran's Day. Year after year our Country remembers the eleventh hour, of the eleventh day, of the eleventh month, and we use that time to honor "all" veterans. I for one am certainly proud of the fact that I am a decorated, combat, veteran (thank God!) and I believe in the parades, etc., but I do not believe that we use that day to honor "all" veterans.

By now you should know that I have timed this letter to the fact of dogs being left-out of the celebration. It seems that somehow we (the country) are able to parade, and make yearly speeches, and generally honor soldiers of the two-legged kind, while the four-legged kind is all but forgotten. There will be no parades for the K-9 heros, and little will be said of them, but you and I will remember. I believe that Veteran's Day, and Memorial Day, are glaring examples of why this project exists. We believe in giving honor to "all" of the veterans. And I strongly believe that when this memorial is finally realized, and a permanent memory is in place, then there will also be a parade, and from that point onward the dogs of war will always be remembered. And by the way, if you have one of our shirts, please wear it on Veteran's Day.

Speaking of the shirts, I have enclosed something which is intended to give you some idea of how the shirts actually work. The need is to get the word out, and these shirts do draw attention to the project. The shirt itself is made in America of dense cotton and polyester (50/50). It is suitable for wear by both men and women, and is available in sizes - S,M,L,XL. If you are involved with dog shows, or are employed in the dog business, then I would especially encourage you to wear one of these commercials during those activities. Many of us are a bit shy about approaching people with regards to the project, and this shirt will help such a person by causing others to respond to you. In other words, if you wear the shirt you can bet that someone will ask you about it. Thanks to Robert Kollar, our logo is both eye-catching and unique. It is his personal creation, and it canneot be found anywhere, except in connection with this memorial. The cost, including postage, is \$10.

Also enclosed is a black and white copy of the enlistment certificate. I say B&W, because the actual certificate is full-color, red, white, and blue. Here again we have a very attractive way of drawing needed attention to our efforts. The certificate is designed to be mounted and displayed for others to see, as it too is both eye-catching and unique. Since it is a memorial

army, I feel it only right that we include dogs of the past. A perfect example of this is the fact that my former scout dog, "Ebony", is the first dog to be registered into this program. Some people are very close to pets who have passed away, and the registration of these dogs is an excellent way to both honor and remember. Also, if you happen to know of someone who has a dog who is special to them, then registering that dog can make an excellent gift. It is certainly a most unique gift idea.

As far as actual news goes, there really isn't much to report. The most significant thing to happen has to do with the phone. Up until last Wednesday, we had relied on my personal phone, but that is no longer the case. The National War Dogs Memorial Project now has its' own phone - (919) 488-8459. I am most often near to the phone, but when I am unable to be here, the answering machine should be on. I must say that it is most encouraging to me how word continues to spread, in spite of the fact that there has been no phone for most of the summer. What this says is that we have heart-felt interest, rather than superficial. We have a long haul before us, and I believe that we have long-haul people with us. Hang in there. Spread the word. And if possible, drop us a line, or give us a call.

You may be interested to know that some people on our mailing list are involved with writing books about war dogs. Some of these are scheduled for release in the near future, and I will surely keep you posted. Mike Bouchard is one such person, and he is producing a collection of stories about canine combat teams. Mike's book, "A Soldier's Best Friend", will include a chapter on me and Ebony, with a special emphasis on the memorial project. Mike's heart is really into this thing, and he includes mention of the project on all of his literature, including his envelopes. And by the way, for some time I have been working on my on book, and several chapters have already been produced. I am presently without the necessary backing, or have yet to find the right publisher, but I do believe that one day I will be able to share my story in a much more expanded form. I have always contended that Ebony is worthy of a movie, and I continue to believe it.

#### In closing, here are a few bits of war dogs trivia.



#### Scout dog heroes in Viet Nam

Like many guys who spent time in the "Nam", I was drafted. The fact of the matter is that I didn't want to go. I disagreed with what was going on over there, but I had stronger feelings with regards to serving my country. Strangely enough, I had high hopes for playing professional baseball, and I was waiting for that draft notice when the other one came. Needless to say, it was not my team of choice.

I had both basic and advanced training at Ft. Gordon, GA, and I spent a good deal of that time praying that I would somehow not get orders for Vietnam. But I did. In September of '69 I arrived in Vietnam and immediately began to pray that I would not be assigned to the 101st Airborne Division. But I was.

Then I prayed that I wouldn't be sent north to I corps, where the heaviest fighting was taking place. But that is exactly where I went. In fact, a C-130 dropped me off right in the heart of I corps, at Base Camp Evans. A Chinook then took me to Camp Sally, and a Huey lifted me right into the boonies.

So I simply prayed for my life, and that prayer was answered.

My actual assignment was with Charlie Company, 2/501st, 101st Airborne Division, in the leech-infested mountains near the city of Hue. My job of point man was given to me on my very first day in the field, and it lasted for 14 months. I would be the first guy down the trail more than 250 times, and live to tell about it. In fact, not one man would die or be wounded while I was on the job.

My good fortune, a whole book in itself, was due in part to my ability as a point man, the talents of my fellow "grunts", and the fact that I had an excellent platoon leader. But most of all, it is because I spent eight months with a black angel who would rather have been dead than to have been a soldier in the Nam.

As far as the military was concerned, this black angel was simply dog # 030M of the 47th Scout Dog Platoon. To me she was a guardian angel in the form of a black female German Shepherd. This wonderful scout dog was


the source of great joy and infinite safety to countless soldiers; and she is the main reason for my being alive today.

I fell in love with scout dogs the very first time I came into contact with one. Up until this time I had never even heard of such a thing. It happened one day while I was cutting a trail for Charlie Company. Most of the day had been spent hacking my way through triple-canopy jungle, when I suddenly broke onto a large trail. It was not your typical old G.I. trail. This was obviously an enemy path, with both heavy and recent traffic—any wider and it could have been a "gook" freeway.

Our platoon leader ordered our movement to stop, and the next thing I knew there was a Huey hovering over our position. A rope was tossed over the side, and a man rappelled down to us. Then, to my total amazement, a dog was lowered down another rope to join the man on the ground. I was so blown away by the whole scene that I grabbed my Instamatic and made sure that I got a picture.

I quickly learned that dog teams were often used on hot trails. These

dogs had a super sense of hearing to be used as an early warning device. They could smell beyond our imagination, to the point of being able to detect underground bunkers. And they were alert for booby-traps. It was a good feeling having that dog out front, especially when I had done it so often without the dog. We would use dog teams several times after that, but I was addicted to the concept after the first time.

After six months with Charlie Company, and never losing a man, I was allowed a transfer to the 47th Scout Dog Platoon-first out of Camp Sally, and then later at Phu Bai. I not only had a strong desire to be a dog handler, but I also had a strange sense of urgency. Something deep within me was telling me that if I wanted to go home alive I had better get out of Charlie Company. I would learn later that within weeks of my getting a transfer, Charlie Company would get ambushed. The point man and six others were killed, and seven more were seriously injured. Many more would die in the months to follow.

When I joined the 47th Scout Dog Platoon I had an excellent reputation as a point man; I was the guy who could get you through it in one piece. Once I got teamed with a dog, things got even better. I was assigned to a dog named Ebony, and she too had an excellent reputation. Several dogs were available to choose from, but she stood alone in both personality and ability. In making my final choice I asked for advice from my fellow handlers, and to a man they all said, Ebony. We would quickly become known throughout the area as the "good luck team".

It is safe to say that a dog team was

called for when you didn't want your own guy at point. These were the times when you expected to get ambushed or booby-trapped, and using the dog was a way of protecting your own men. A dog team was rarely used on a safe trail, and often we were called to a mission where enemy contact was being made right up until the time we got there.

One guy in my platoon got shot at on every single mission he went on. Another guy, who had transferred in at about the same time as I did, was "wasted" in an ambush on only his second trip out. Dangerous missions were the routine of a scout dog handler, but it was never routine.

The fact that I had first walked point without a dog enhanced my ability as a dog handler, and made me somewhat unique to the trade. My record of safety stayed with me, but the real credit has to go to Ebony; she was better at point than any human could even hope to be. Our record of safety quickly spread throughout the lines. It was not at all unusual for me to get off a chopper with Ebony, at who-knows-where in the jungle, and hear someone say, "Hey! There's that guy and his black dog. Now everything is gonna be O.K." And it would be.

Ebony was truly a great scout dog. A hero in every sense of the word. She would find booby-traps before any soldier could get maimed. She would alert us to an ambush being set up more than 50 yards away. Some have said that she could even hear a mortar being loaded on a distant hill. More guys than can be counted are alive

today because of this dog.

But she had perhaps an even greater talent as an ambassador of smiles. No matter how down and out you wereno matter how bad things had been-Ebony could fill your face with joy. She gave more smiles to combat soldiers in need than any Bob Hope or USO show ever could. She was more than an entertainer-she was a soldier!

The thing that made Ebony most famous, and most remembered, was not her ability to beg you out of an LRP dinner, or your prized peaches and pound cake. It was a trick that she had learned before my time, and it was centered around the command "dead dog". You would say, "Ebony, would you rather be in the Army or be a dead dog?" She would drop over dead every time, and she seemed to love doing it. At this point in the war most combat soldiers had a poor opinion of the military, and it really cracked them up to see this dog which felt the same way.

Some guys in the Scout Dog Platoon will remember the day we put headphones over Ebony's ears, and she bobbed her head to the beat of a Jimi Hendrix record. Others will forever remember her as the dog which didn't like the Army, and would make them smile and feel good while in the midst of adversity. And many more will remember her as the dog which found the booby-trap, or heard the impending ambush.

I am convinced that she was more than just a black dog. She was an Angel. Hers is a story worthy of a movie, or a monument.

## Royal Hecht Awards

(Revised 11/18/88)

The Royal Hecht Awards were initiated several years ago in honor of a past member. The initial awards have been expanded upon to include a wide variety of titles and/or achievements.

### Rules and Regulations

The following are the requirements which must be met to compete for and/or be awarded a Royal Hecht as set forth by the German Shepherd Dog Club of St. Louis, Inc.

### I. GENERAL

- A. Owner: In order to be awarded a Royal Hecht Plaque, a member must meet the qualifications which would enable them to vote in the election of officers in January (i.e., attendance requirements, work hour requirements, and financial requirements as designated in Article V, Sec. 4 (a) of the GSDCSL Constitution and By-Laws (1/17/86)). These requirements could be met by an Associate Member as well as a Regular Member. Under unusual and/or extraordinary circumstances, a member may petition the appointed committee to waive any of the above requirements.
- B. Dog: Your dog must be an AKC registered German Shepherd Dog and must be six months of age or older.
- C. Titles from nationally and internationally recognized organizations (e.g., AKC, CKC, GSDCA, ATTS, SV, USA, DVG, etc.) will be considered. (See Sec. III below for specific titles)
- D. Titles will be recognized if the owner was a member of the GSDCSL at the time the title was earned.

### II. SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

A. ROYAL HECHT BRED BY EXHIBITOR AWARD: You must be the breeder and owner or co-owner. You or a member of your immediate family or co-owner must handle the dog only. (Immediate family includes father, mother, sister, brother, wife, husband, son, or daughter.) Points toward the Royal Hecht Bred By Award will be awarded in proportion to the

competition entered in each individual class. There is no restriction as to the number of dogs. NOTE: All entries count, not just those who show.

B. ROYAL HECHT BEST PUPPY AWARD: You must be the owner or co-owner of the dog. Points toward the Royal Hecht Best Puppy Award will be awarded in proportion to the competition entered in each individual class (i.e., The Puppy Classes Only). There is no restriction as to the number of dogs. NOTE: All entries count, not just those who show.

### C. ROYAL HECHT OBEDIENCE AWARDS:

ROYAL HECHT NOVICE OBEDIENCE AWARD: This award will be awarded to the dog with the highest combination of scores from the three official legs for the Companion Dog title.

ROYAL HECHT ADVANCED OBEDIENCE AWARD: This award will be awarded to the dog with the highest combination of three scores in the Open and/or Utility classes in a calendar year. If the scores from only the three official legs of a newly earned advanced title (i.e., CDX or UD) are used for this award, five (5) points will be added to their total and the calendar year restriction is waived.

- D. ROYAL HECHT DUAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD: The Royal Hecht Dual Achievement Award will be awarded to the dog with the highest score. The score will be based on the number of dogs defeated while placing in any regular class (as in the Bred By Award) plus the total of three qualifying scores in any regular obedience class in a calendar year.
- E. ROYAL HECHT JUNIOR HANDLER AWARD: Junior Handlers are eligible whose parent(s) meet the membership requirements as delineated above (Sec. I, A). Points toward this award will be awarded in proportion to the competition entered in each individual class (Junior Handler Classes Only).
- F. ROYAL HECHT SERVICE DOG BREEDER AWARD: An award will be given to a member who is the breeder of a dog who enters service during the calendar year (e.g., K-9, Guide Dog, military, Support Dog, etc.). The dog must be considered in full time service to be eligible for this award.

### III. RECOGNIZED TITLES AND PLAQUES

The following are guidelines for the standardization of plaque size for specific titles/awards: Four sized of plaques have been awarded (small, medium, large and extra large).

The chairperson is not required to make calls and inquiries about degrees, titles, achievements, etc.
