TREASURER REPORT

Don Krueger presented the treasurer report for May 1, 1990 to May 31, 1990 and it was filed for audit.

The contract price was \$1.100 and we currently have \$800 in pladges. Helene suggested that we bring it up to the membership as to whether we will continue to have trophies. They are not always the perfect answer; especially where, as with this last show they were this expensive and not covered. Harold mentioned that we will not have them for the fall show. 





Royal Hecht Awards

(Revised 11/18/88)

The Royal Hecht Awards were initiated several years ago in honor of a past member. The initial awards have been expanded upon to include a wide variety of titles and/or achievements.

Rules and Regulations

The following are the requirements which must be met to compete for and/or be awarded a Royal Hecht as set forth by the German Shepherd Dog Club of St. Louis, Inc.

I. GENERAL

- A. Owner: In order to be awarded a Royal Hecht Plaque, a member must meet the qualifications which would enable them to vote in the election of officers in January (i.e., attendance requirements, work hour requirements, and financial requirements as designated in Article V, Sec. 4 (a) of the GSDCSL Constitution and By-Laws (1/17/86)). These requirements could be met by an Associate Member as well as a Regular Member. Under unusual and/or extraordinary circumstances, a member may petition the appointed committee to waive any of the above requirements.
- B. $\underline{\text{Dog}}$: Your dog must be an AKC registered German Shepherd $\overline{\text{Dog}}$ and must be six months of age or older.
- C. Titles from nationally and internationally recognized organizations (e.g., AKC, CKC, GSDCA, ATTS, SV, USA, DVG, etc.) will be considered. (See Sec. III below for specific titles)
- D. Titles will be recognized if the owner was a member of the GSDCSL at the time the title was earned.

II. SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

A. ROYAL HECHT BRED BY EXHIBITOR AWARD: You must be the breeder and owner or co-owner. You or a member of your immediate family or co-owner must handle the dog only. (Immediate family includes father, mother, sister, brother, wife, husband, son, or daughter.) Points toward the Royal Hecht Bred By Award will be awarded in proportion to the

^{*}dog must be shown in the Bred-By-Exhibitor class to be awarded points.

competition entered in each individual class. There is no restriction as to the number of dogs. NOTE: All entries count, not just those who show.

- B. ROYAL HECHT BEST PUPPY AWARD: You must be the owner or co-owner of the dog. Points toward the Royal Hecht Best Puppy Award will be awarded in proportion to the competition entered in each individual class (i.e., The Puppy Classes Only). There is no restriction as to the number of dogs. NOTE: All entries count, not just those who show.
- C. ROYAL HECHT OBEDIENCE AWARDS:

ROYAL HECHT NOVICE OBEDIENCE AWARD: This award will be awarded to the dog with the highest combination of scores from the three official legs for the Companion Dog title.

ROYAL HECHT ADVANCED OBEDIENCE AWARD: This award will be awarded to the dog with the highest combination of three scores in the Open and/or Utility classes in a calendar year. If the scores from only the three official legs of a newly earned advanced title (i.e., CDX or UD) are used for this award, five (5) points will be added to their total and the calendar year restriction is waived.

- D. ROYAL HECHT DUAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD: The Royal Hecht Dual Achievement Award will be awarded to the dog with the highest score. The score will be based on the number of dogs defeated while placing in any regular class (as in the Bred By Award) plus the total of three qualifying scores in any regular obedience class in a calendar year.
- E. ROYAL HECHT JUNIOR HANDLER AWARD: Junior Handlers are eligible whose parent(s) meet the membership requirements as delineated above (Sec. I, A). Points toward this award will be awarded in proportion to the competition entered in each individual class (Junior Handler Classes Only).
- F. ROYAL HECHT SERVICE DOG BREEDER AWARD: An award will be given to a member who is the breeder of a dog who enters service during the calendar year (e.g., K-9, Guide Dog, military, Support Dog, etc.). The dog must be considered in full time service to be eligible for this award.

III. RECOGNIZED TITLES AND PLAQUES

The following are guidelines for the standardization of plaque size for specific titles/awards: Four sized of plaques have been awarded (small, medium, large and extra large).

IV. RESPONSIBILITY: It is the responsibility of the dog's owner to contact the person responsible for the Royal Hecht Awards and provide the correct name, title(s) earned, the date the title was officially awarded, scores if applicable, or any other necessary information. The chairperson is not required to make calls and inquiries about degrees, titles, achievements, etc.

NOTE: The existing Royal Hecht Rules and Regulations were modified at the regular monthly meeting on November 18, 1988, after the revisions had been presented during the October 21, 1988 regular monthly membership meeting and were published in the Wag 'N' Tongue (Nov. 1988 issue).



A Way To Afford Public Relations & Publicity by Nancy Yadon Kearney

Don and Helene Bridges solved a big problem for the German Shepherd Dog Club of St. Louis.

The club has given an Outstanding Service Award to the St. Louis Canine Corps for the last nineteen years. The award brings our club and the Canine Corps excellent local publicity, both television and newspapers, which is very good for the Breed itself. We have always sent out lots of press releases to the newspapers and public service announcements to the radio stations. At the same, time we adopted the K-9 Corps as a civic project in order to give something back to the community. We try to find dogs for them, keep the cemetery pretty (with lots of help from the officers), or get equipment they might need. All of these activities provided good public relations. Unfortunately, they also began to cost a great deal.

Postage and thank you notes could run \$30 or more. Each officer received a photograph and, of course, pictures were needed for articles in the

Review and Dog World. These had gone up in price alarmingly. The German Shepherd Dog medallions on a ribbon, to hang around the dog's neck, stayed about the same price—the cost ran between \$5-\$6. The lovely walnut plaque for the winner, the larger retirees' plaque, and list of winners' plaque for the office became very expensive. The Winner's certificate and Honorable Mention certificates which were individually typeset on parchment paper cost more every year. We also provided lunch for the officers and their families. The award was beginning to cost between \$200 and \$300 to do it properly.

The club wanted to continue to present the award and to do it with style, but income was going down and expenses were going up, just as they are for everyone.

"K-9 Crime Busters, Support Your Local K-9 Corps," Is the slogan dreamed up by Helene and Don. They had hats and T-shirts made with the slogan and some paw prints. They are fantastic. To promote the Items, they came up with a poster featuring Olrac's Little Murdock, owned by Walter and Louise Leistner, behind bars dressed in a prison outfit and wearing handcuffs. Ch. Bridgehaus' Hercules v Teela TT, TDI, owned by Helene Bridges, was put in a police shirt and hat. The local police precinct allowed them to take the pictures in a cell. That poster really gets attention, and that in turn sells the hats and T-shirts. K-9 officers from other municipalities even buy them, because they fit any unit. The general public has bought quite a few. Don and Helene set up the booth at various functions around the area featuring dogs, as well as at club matches and shows.

The Bridges also approached local businesses and asked for support for the project. A former club member, Dee Martin of Dee's Printing in Fenton, MO, was kind enough to donate the certificates for the awards. Some businesses donated items that could be sold or raffled and some gave donations. A donation jar is always present at the K-9 Crime Busters exhibit. The public is generous.

Countless hours were spent trying to find a way to get the same quality at less expense. They searched discount stores for frames and checked prices for printing the poster. (People wanted to buy copies of that too.)

Don's mother makes quilts as a hobby. She was kind enough to donate a large quilt with a matching smaller quilt to be raffled. That got the fund off to

a good start. The club put up \$100 to buy the first order of hats and T-shirts. It was returned quickly.

Another idea is to dress a stuffed German Shepherd Dog in a hat and coat with K-9 Corps on it, then raffle the dog. The dog is purchased, but the outfit isn't made yet—but it will be.

Thanks to a tremendous amount of effort on the part of Don and Helene Bridges and their K-9 Crime Busters project, they succeeded in making the Canine Corps Award something our club could continue to present. The two of them keep coming up with ideas to raise money, so it is hoped the club will be able to start another award project for the Canine Corps of the surrounding municipalities sometime in the future.

We are sharing this story in hopes that it will stimulate other German Shepherd Dog Clubs around the country to come up with good publicity ideas, as well as the way to pay for them. We'd also like to hear other people's ideas.
