## Modern Fertility Rites For The Brood Bitch

For those of you fortunate enough to have animals that never miss when bred, I offer a toast...the rest of us will spend our nights crying in our beer, wondering why the most valuable bitch we've ever owned avoids motherhood so religiously.

There's no easy answer to "Why" but some notable people have been studying fertility problems and working with dogs that exhibit them. Before I begin discussing the problems and possible solutions, some of these breeders and veterinarians should be acknowledged..Scotie Sherlock of Caralon Kennels, a good friend and longtime breeder who has freely shared her experience, Dr. Charles Kruger, a veterinarian and well-known breeder, and my own veterinarian, Dr. Lon Cromley, who has spent many hours worrying with me and attempting to fertilize some problem bitches. They have shared their knowledge, dearly earned, to help me build a foundation... and I am grateful.

The primary lesson that we have to learn is that each case is different. Though we may follow similar steps to determine the problems, there may be a hundred different solutions, or none at all.

Failure to conceive falls into three broad categories;

- A) Physical- a fault in the structure of the reproductive system or an injury, which may require corrective surgery;
- B) Hormonal- an imbalance in hormonal makeup ranging from the thyroid to estrogen; and,
- C) Infection- Any number of bacteria and virus grow well in the warm dampness of the uterus and vaginal tract.

To complicate matters, many bitches have problems in more than one of these categories- often one making another worse. For example, I believe that we find a far higher percentage of infections in bitches which have placed vulva. Perhaps that low placement, which results in (or is a result of) a steep vaginal tract, traps infection in the uterus and fosters its growth.

In regard to this first category, physical problems, I'll only mention that a competent veterinarian should recognize difficulties of this type which would require surgery. Before a maiden bitch is bred she should have a complete physical examination, during which abnormalities should be noted.

Also before breeding, EACH TIME, your veterinarian should perform a white blood cell count and a canine brucellosis test. Most stud dog owners require the latter as a protection to their dog. The brucella is easily passed during mating and results in sterility. The white blood cell count if above the normal range indicates an infection is present. If all appears normal on this initial check, but the bitch does not conceive, we do the following things, in the order indicated:



First, we check to make sure the stud dog has recently sired other litters...to often it is the stud dog, not the bitch who missed. If the stud is producing normally, it is time to check out our prospective mother.

Six weeks before the bitch is due in season, we begin adding 800 i.u. of Vitamin E to her daily meal. It is very good for tissue and muscle strengthening. At this same time, we take her to the vet and have him draw a blood sample for Thyroid testing. The sample should be sent to Dr. R. F. Nachreiner, Dept. of Physiology and Pharmacology, School of Veterinarian Medicine, Auburn University, Auburn, Alabama, 36830. If your veterinarian wishes to call him, his number is (205) 826-4000. He is the foremost expert on canine thyroid imbalance in the United States, and a very helpful gentleman. Most thyroid problems can be artificially corrected by medication (Synthroid, Cytobin, etc.) so that your bitch can conceive. Dr. Nachreiner returns his test results with recommended treatment to your veterinarian. (A four year old bitch which we own had been bred twice with no results. A thyroid test showed that her T3 and T4 function were far below normal. After a year and a half on Cytobin, her Thyroid functions are normal-even without the medication, and two months ago she presented us with thirteen puppies). The test results take ten days to two weeks to be returned, and it takes some time to achieve a satisfactory level of medication; so do not delay running the test.

Also at this crucial time...have veterinarian use a "Tom-Cat Catheter (#3 French)" to reach past her cervix into the uterus. This catheter is so small that it can be slid through even the tightest bitch to enable the vet to obtain a sample of the uterine secretions for a culture and sensitivity test. While he has the catheter in the uterus (after he has obtained the sample for his culture) have him infuse her with one part Iodine to ten parts distilled water. Do not bother with antibiotics at this time because you do not know what type of infection she has, if she has one at all, and, if she does, which antibiotics will kill it. Dogs, like people, get infections which are resistant to some drugs a car load of that drug will not dent the infection, and you may cause problems with drug interactions when the correct antibiotic is determined by the sensitivity tests and administered.

When the results of the culture and sensitivity come back, have the vet again use a Tom Cat Catheter to reach into the uterus and if there is an infection, infuse her with the drug indicated by the tests. You may also inject her with the injectible form of that drug.

On the first day of her season, again infuse her with the drug of choice (or the Iodine and water solution), if no infection was present. Run the CBC (blood count) and a Brucellosis Test. If your bitch is older, or has missed several times in a row, and you can't afford to wait through one more season to find out if the problem is more than an infection, you may wish on the first day to give her a shot of follicle stimulating

hormone (FSh). We use a fresh full pack with half dilution. This hormone stimulates the season to make it stronger. On the eighth day of her season, if she had an infection, we again infuse her with the drug of choice (as indicated by the sensitivity test). If we have decided to include the hormone treatment, we give her a second full pack of fresh FSh.

If you are pursuing the hormone treatment, be sure to make arrangements with the stud dog owner (if the bitch is being shipped) to have an LH (Lutinizing Hormone) as soon as possible after she is bred. The Lutinizing Hormone causes the bitch to release eggs to be fertilized. Since the life span of the sperm is limited, this shot should be administered within twentyfour hours of breeding...it should never be given before breeding because if the stud dog does not care to breed the bitch for three days after she has had her shot, you have wasted her season possibly.

If the bitch's previous infertility was due to hormonal deficiency or infection, and these practices have been followed she should now be pregnant and in nine weeks, you will be a breeder...

Before I end, let me say that vaginal smears have a very definite place in breeding, BUT, it is NOT IN DETERMINING INFECTIONS OR WHICH MEDICATIONS TO USE. Reading the vaginal smears is a tool with which to chart the progress of the season, and when the smear has cleared, and the cells are 80% or more cornified, the bitch should be ready to breed. When white blood cells re-appear after this 11-36 hour period, and optimum results should be realized if she is bred then. Vaginal smears only confirm what the partners' actions should indicate. The ideal method of following smears is to take two or three smears per day an inexpensive microscope and a lesson or two from a co-operative veterinarian or breeder friend who knows how to read slides will make it easy for you to do this at home... by doing slides each day of the bitch's season, a trend develops, rather than getting a hit-or-miss, one-time, reading which can be inaccurate.

Some animals are permanently infertile. Some bitches (particularly those who come in season on a 4-5 month cycle) are fertile only every other season. No one can guarantee 100% success in treating in-fertility, but we have many diagnostic and corrective tools at our disposal. If we use these wisely, under the supervision of a competent veterinarian, we consistently achieve better results with our brood animals.

We Need To Fight Breed Restrictive Laws - Canine Defense Fund/American Dog Owners Association In Forefront of Battle By Nancy Yadon Kearney

Thank you for printing this article in your newsletter.

American Dog Owners Association deals with issues of importance to all members of the dog fancy community in this country; trying to educate dog owners and legislators. They are instrumental in overseeing regulations for shipping dogs; working to make it safer. Another project is seeking to allow the elderly in federal housing projects to keep their dogs, whatever the size. (There is a definite correlation between the attitude of public housing directors and the two major legal battles facing the dog fancy today.) Many goals are on the agenda, but two of the most pressing at this point in time are fighting the limiting dog legislation, and the laws that would make owning a particular breed a crime. The Canine Defense Fund deals solely with this latter issue.

For the average person to fight these type of laws individually is impossible. The municipality/local government has resources far beyond any single person's ability to cope. They can force you to run to court over and over again without accomplishing anything at all, except to make your employer angry and scare you to death. The wear and tear on you emotionally from this kind of stress is overwhelming. Many times they (the local government body) are not the least bit interested in your civil rights, because they realize that you probably are not in a position to call their hand on the issue. Don't count on ex post facto law (better known as the "grandfather clause"). It can cost you thousands of dollars to make the local government recognize your civil rights and the guarantee of Article I, Section 9.3 of the Constitution. It can be years before a case reaches the higher courts. The expense is staggering and so is the emotional price. Attorney fees (at a rate of \$85 to \$250 an hour) mount with a speed that takes your breath away; and you are not even on the agenda of a higher court where a decision will carry more weight.

Everyone involved with the legitimate sports associated with dogs must band together and support American Dog Owners Association and the Canine Defense Fund. You believe that because your neighbors have ignored the fact that you have 3 or 4 more dogs than you are supposed to have protects you. You are living in a fool's paradise because any change in neighbors or circumstances could pull down your safety. Perhaps you believe that the breed of dog of which you are particularly fond is so well thought of by the general public that no one would ever think to try to make owning one against the law. Nonsense! Whatever the size, whatever the reputation of your breed - IT IS ENDANGERED! It is just farther down the list than the Bull Terriers, German Shepherd Dogs, etc. Be assured that someone out there thinks your breed is a nuisance that should be legislated out of existence. What is more, given today's climate, they can and will try to do just that - OUTLAW YOUR BREED OF DOG!

There has been some success at this point in fighting breed restricting legislation. The law in Broward County, Florida (includes part of the City of Miami) applying to Bull Terriers and Staffordshire Terriers was declared unconstitutional by the state court. But cities all over the United States are contemplating similar laws about several different breeds. The Canine Defense Fund is leading this battle and the expense is spectacular. Contributions to this fund are desperately needed. Checks should be made out to The Canine Defense Fund and can be sent c/o American Dog Owners Association, Inc., 1654 Columbia Turnpike, Castleton, New York 12033. The American Kennel Club will match any funds donated by a club.



## We Need To Fight Breed Restrictive Laws (Continued)

Because of the fantastic expenses associated with these two major projects, money is a constant problem. Please join American Dog Owners Association as a club and as individuals. Contact your parent club and pass the message on to everyone involved in the dog fancy that you meet how important it is that they too join. Checks for dues should be made out to American Dog Owners Association and sent to 1654 Columbia Turnpike, Castleton, New York 12033. The cost is \$25 for a club, \$10 for an individual, \$15 for husband and wife, or \$100 for a business. When you belong to ADOA you receive several copies of their newsletter throughout the year that keeps you up to date on the various activities and the status of legislation throughout the country.)

ADOA has available free of charge (for the cost of postage only) educational brochures, various forms, etc. Some clubs have donated the proceeds from a fun match or other fund raising activity. Some have indicated in their premium list that a portion of the proceeds of their dog show would go to American Dog Owners Association or the Canine Defense Fund.

Please send donations to the Canine Defense Fund, and join and support American Dog Owners Association. The monetary viability of both organizations is crucial to the survival of the dog fancy community in the United States!

There is something else necessary in order to assure the continued existence of your breed. Everyone involved in the various sports associated with dogs must become more politically active. Make sure you are a registered voter in your municipality and vote. Know and talk with your aldermen or councilmen. Make them aware of the fact that while you whole heartedly support dangerous dog legislation, you are totally opposed to breed specific legislation. Give them a copy of the model legislation supported by ADOA. It is far cheaper to prevent legislation from being passed than it is to pay attorney's fees to fight laws that are in existence. Get to know your local legislators. Have sympathetic friends and relatives do the same whether in your municipality or in another one. Work the polls for candidates that will support the proper type of legislation. Work against those that would eliminate a breed. Go to the aldermanic/council meetings with the clubs that are actively fighting for their lives now. Show your support by joining them at these meetings. Their fight will carry more weight if local people are behind them, or are leading the battle for them.

One contemplated law would limit all dogs to 20 inches. It is not clear whether they are measuring at the withers or the head. This would effectively eliminate almost all of the breeds except some toys and terriers.

Two things we all can and must do to protect our continued existence. Support the Canine Defense Fund and get involved in local politics! We cannot let the presently endangered breeds fight alone - their plight is ours as well!!! Get involved in your local politics and help prevent and fight laws that would literally mean DOOM to the ALL the Dog Fancy.

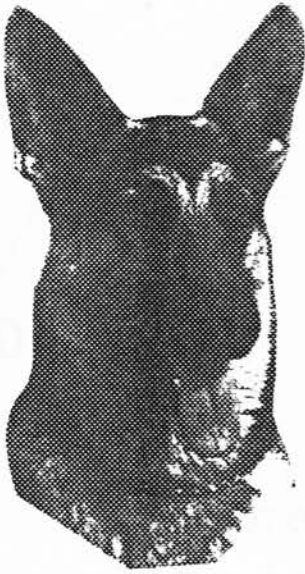

\*\*\*\*BREEDING YOUR BITCH\*\*\*\*

By Dr. Charles Kruger, DVM

This article is designed to be a simple guide to the novice breeder. I shall attempt to point out a few do's and don'ts in breeding your bitch.

The first consideration must be your bitch. You must ask yourself or someone who can tell you in case you really don't know, "what are my bitch's faults?" Of course your bitch doesn't have any faults, but just for fun and an intelligent, objective approach to this breeding, let's pretend that your bitch does have a fault, or two, or three or more. If you don't feel sure enough about your own opinion-and most novices should not be sure of themselves- go to a few local, well-established breeders and ask their opinions as to the faults in your animal. Remember also that you probably will not want to go back to the breeder of your bitch unless you want to hear a lot of flowery comments about her. Few breeders will willingly criticize their own breeding. There are few breeders who approach dog breeding objectively enough to give you a truthful evaluation of a bitch they have sold you. After you have two or three different opinions of your dog's faults that were mentioned by both or all parties, they probably are ones you should consider as most important.

The second consideration of your bitch is that of her pedigree- is your bitch an outcross, linebred, or inbred? If your bitch an outcross, does she come from a dominant line? Does she show the qualities or faults of this particular line? If she is from a dominant line and does show the characteristics from this line (good or bad) she is then more likely to transmit them to her offspring than if she does not show them in her own make-up. (I cannot go into an explanation here but take my word for it.) If, however, your bitch is an outcross and shows no particular characteristics attributable to her pedigree you cannot really calculate in advance what she will produce. If your bitch is a linebred or inbred animal, you will generally have a little better chance of tracing down, in her pedigree, the good and bad characteristics she possesses. Naturally, to know the ancestry of your bitch it will most likely be necessary to contact the breeders or owners of the animal or animals on which she is linebred or inbred. If possible at all, I would advise you to personally observe her common ancestors.

When you have thoroughly analyzed your bitch and her pedigree, you may then, and only then, consider your stud. In considering a stud dog, remember first and most important is the fact that he compensates for your bitch's faults with his own correct attributes. (Editor's note: underlining for effect)

is my own.) Many people believe that opposite compensation will correct their bitch's faults-- this is not the case. For example, a definite back weakness (sway back) will not produce good, strong, correct backs if bred to a roach back. Always correct a fault with proper or correct structure.

There are cases where you cannot always compensate for your bitch's faults. In these cases, you must consider the seriousness of the faults which cannot be compensated. I personally believe I would give a little and breed to an animal with an outstanding gait, even if he had a common fault with my bitch. However, I would never breed two animals with soft backs, poor rear angulation or poor movement (and good structure). Let us now consider the stud dog. What should you look for in a stud dog? Assuming that the dog you are considering does compensate for your bitch's faults, next consider his overall quality. One must never overlook the stud's individual qualities. What you see in the dog we refer to as phenotype, and most often his phenotype is a large percent of his genotype (the features you don't see but which are present in his genes in the germ cells). There are a few fair dogs that are good producers, but these are few and far between. Granted, sometimes there are stud dogs which are never shown and thus never become champions. These non-show studs must be evaluated carefully and a careful study of their offspring must be made before you consider using them. I speak from experience in this matter as I have a non-show stud that is an excellent producer, but for some personal reasons we have never campaigned the dog.

If there are champion quality males in your area, these dogs should probably be given your first consideration. A show championship does not always mean the dog is going to be a producer. However, in studying the ROM animals in the United States, one will see that the great producers for the most part, are truly quality animals. If you can, find a champion or near champion animal who compensates for your bitch's faults.

Next, consider the pedigree. Pedigree study is difficult and time consuming, and often not very rewarding. If you have a heavily linebred bitch, you may safely outcross. As a rule, if my bitches are linebred 1,2-2, 2-2,3,3--or 2,3,4, I hesitate to breed to a stud which has that common ancestor closer than his grandsire or dam on one side. A brief word of explanation about the above numbers--i.e., 1 means a parent (sire or dam), 2 means a grandparent, 3 means a great-grandparent, 4 means a great, great grandparent. The numbers represent the generation on the pedigree in which the ancestor appears. However, if you have an animal that is an outcross bitch, you should look for a heavily linebred male or a male closely related to your bitch. Too often I have heard pedigree scanners say, "Oh, there is so and so, he appears in my bitch's pedigree, this would make a good breeding." This comment was made to me recently by an experienced breeder of 9 years. She picked out one of the poor-



est specimens of the breed on which to create a linebreeding. Linebreeding must be on good specimens--otherwise you face utter disaster. One of the most ideal linebreedings is that of a niece to her uncle, or a nephew to an aunt. The late Herb Abbot (Seahurst Kennels), who contributed more to the breed in the Northwest than any other individual in my time, once quoted to me the following breeder's formula: "the sire of the sire should be the grandsire of the dam on the dam's side."\* This is a sound formula, providing again, that you are linebreeding on good individuals.

The foremost consideration for a stud dog is his producing ability. This can only be evaluated through the quality and accomplishments of his offspring. I feel that the novice should only breed to a proven producer.

I do not think that the novice breeder's bitch should be the proving ground for a big breeder's stud dog. This has happened continuously in the past in our area. The newest import from "Trans-a-vania" gets the big push--all the novice breeders rush to the new dog--they all have pups and none of the pups are quality animals--shortly thereafter the stud is sold to Timbucktoo! I feel it is the large breeder's responsibility to prove the producing ability of his stud dogs. If he cannot do this service to the breed and to the novice, he is not a very reputable breeder. I urge you, one and all, don't be a guinea pig for a large breeder's new stud.

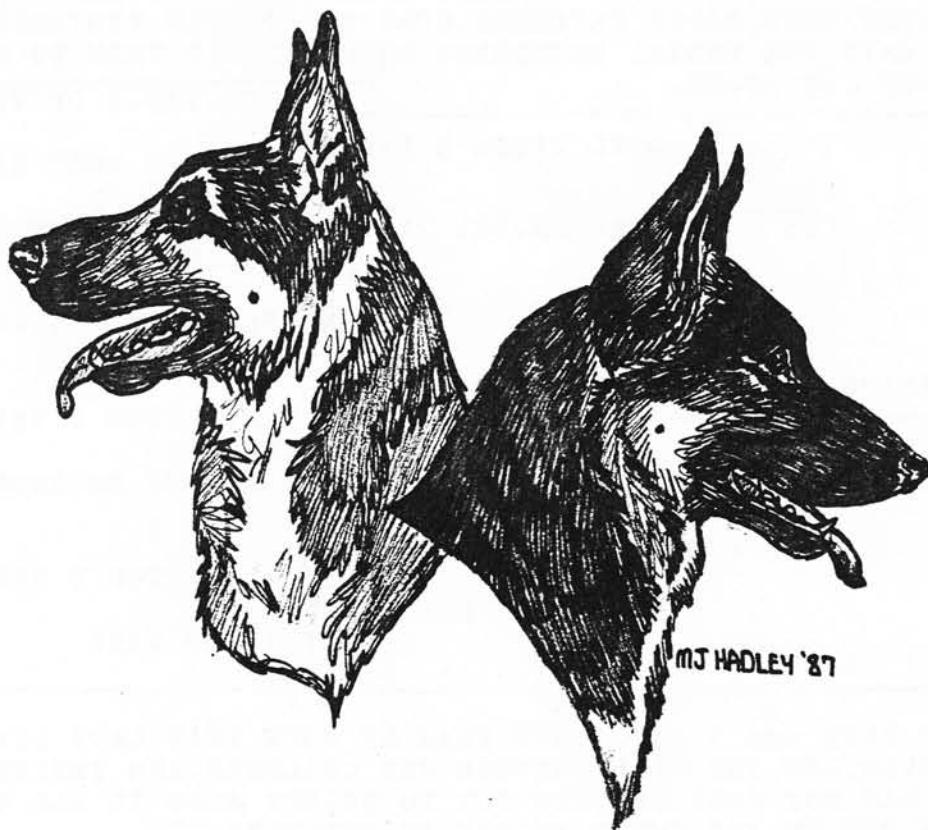

Annual Policy & Procedures

The revised new GSDCA POLICY AND PROCEDURES MANUAL has just now come off the presses. It consists of approximately 60 reasonably small-print single space professionally set-up pages, the equivalent of perhaps 120 regular pages. It lists Board functions, procedures and form letters, committee purposes and duties, plus a wealth of additional information that graphically describe the ongoing thrust and duties of your Club and the rules it operates by, based on previous input. Needless to say, the Manual reproduces only previous motions, guidelines and methods which are always subject to change if so ordered by the Board.

The Manual even has a 2-page Index, listing all headings and their respective page locations. Future updates can easily be integrated into the existing Manual.

This Manual has been primarily produced for the use of GSDCA Board members and Committee Chairpersons and also the National Specialty Show Assisting Club. The Board has additionally agreed to allow the sale of the Manual to the membership if so requested. The cost of a subscription is \$50.00. This includes an up-to-date Manual plus quarterly updates to the end of the fiscal year plus the complete year thereafter. Example: Buy a Manual in October 1987 and receive free updates for 1987 and 1988. If you send me a check for \$50.00 made out to the "GSDCA" on January 2, 1988 and you will receive the Manual and free updates through 1988 & 1989.

Subscription rates for yearly updates thereafter are \$20.00 per year, payable before the first of the year.

I personally feel strongly that those persons desirous of serving on the Board or heading a GSDCA committee in the future avail themselves to a Manual. And there are others who simply wish to be informed. A clearer understanding of the Board and its enormous work load will make it easier to cut through the misinformation that is regularly disseminated, knowingly or unknowingly.

It is interesting to reproduce a short history of the manual. Sam Lawrence and Bob Williamson ferreted all original information from Board minutes going back perhaps 10 to 15 years. Carmen Battaglia created the first Manuals, put them on computer, and disseminated them. When I took over the chairmanship of this committee last year, I made certain revisions and alphabetized the entire Manual. Board members and committee chairpersons were asked to make changes in their listings, if necessary. New text was added. An ad hoc POLICY AND PROCEDURES COMMITTEE consisting of Helen Fisher, Jane Bennett, Bob Williamson, Dorothy Linn, Blanche Beisswenger, and myself as chairman spent 14 hours in a marathon pre-Board meeting during April 1987 checking the revised text for accuracy. Dorothy Linn then wrote up all changes ordered by the ad hoc committee, literally re-typing the new draft Manual. The entire final product was then entered into the Parent Club computer by Lois Fryslyn and set up the pages that make up the new Manual. She had been given Board permission to charge for this service but donated her labors and that of others free of charge, as I understand it. All the above persons have earned the thanks of the Parent Club.

GSDCA members in attendance at the 1987 National were able to see the new Manual on display. Those who did not will find it to be a pleasant

AKC Delegate's Board Report Annual

Jane Bennett

Newly-elected President Kenneth Marden presided at the Delegates' Meeting September 15, 1987. Two hundred seventy-four (274) were in attendance.

The rule change relative to defeated dogs that I reported at the July meeting was adopted. It is not possible under the new rules for a dog defeated in the classes and entered in any other class to be shown for Best of Breed.

New rule changes to be noted on at the December meeting concern mainly all-breed shows, superintendents and storage of original entry forms. There is a request to raise the deposit with a written protest lodged against a dog at a show from \$5.00 to \$25.00. There are also some Field Trial Rule proposals but I usually abstain on these unless I am familiar with the problem.

The Delegate Advisory Committee to Study Show Policies next reported on their findings after 12 months study. Most of the changes proposed by the committee and recommended by the Board refer to all-breed clubs and/or all-breed shows: Cluster show, decrease in Sanctioned Match Shows, training classes, breeder referral services, educational programs, public service such as programs in schools, 4-H, libraries, rescue associations. These are policy changes and will be acted upon by the Board. However, there are two specific amendments to Dog Show Rules to be voted upon at the December meeting. They are: Elimination of Best of Winners and the requirement that a dog receive one major after 18 months of age before acquiring the championship title.\*

Previous to the Delegates' Meeting I participated in a lengthy briefing session of Parent Club Delegates on the program to improve breed standards. This program was recommended by the Delegates' Advisory Committee on Judging Research and Development. It was emphasized repeatedly that the A.K.C. does not intend to change breed standards but to make certain all are complete, in standard order and in uniform vocabulary. Every breed standard will be evaluated and each club will receive a report. There is no urgency for our club to do anything at this time but at some future time it will be necessary to have a committee appointed to work with the A.K.C.

At Mrs. Fisher's request I inquired whether the Registration Department at A.K.C. would furnish a monthly printout of new registrants' names and addresses so some committee of our Board could send each non-member a packet of educational material. I was told this would be impossible under their present setup and so I wrote the attached letter. I may receive a reply.\*\*

ATTENTION REGIONAL CLUB SECRETARIES: This is a move-up year for show dates. The priority date is about six days later. Also, the A.K.C. has computerized your show date and sends you your date for the next show when it has processed the current one for the similar date, i.e., all records in, etc. The Parent Club also receives a copy. In order to report to the Parent Club Board your show date, it is still necessary to send a sentence with the date request on your letterhead. You may use the A.K.C. form, if you don't need it back. You will still require a list of Parent Club personnel; who will forward medals, publish Review show dates, etc. This I send to whoever in your club sends in the show request date. SECRETARIES. If you have a newletter, please give this copy to the editor.

After four days at my house she freely whelped these puppies in the kennel building while I was at work. I put them all to sleep except two males because they were mix breeds. Since I bought her as a brood bitch, I had to see if she would be a good mother. Her next breeding was to Forest Knoll's T.N.T., a solid black Phantom son. Out of this litter came my very first Champion, Ch. Caralon's Nicholas of Judeen, C.D. who has produced three Champions to date with several progeny pointed and near their Championship. Jasmine is a natural retriever and will play ball til she drops. She teaches all my puppies to play ball and retrieve. Jasmine was bred to Ch. Brimhall's Triumphant Tony and produced some beautiful conformation and obedience dogs. She was last bred to Ch. Lothario of Heinerburg which produced my lovely new brood bitch, Judeen's Princess Lea. Lea took fourth in her Futurity class and now has her first reserve win. 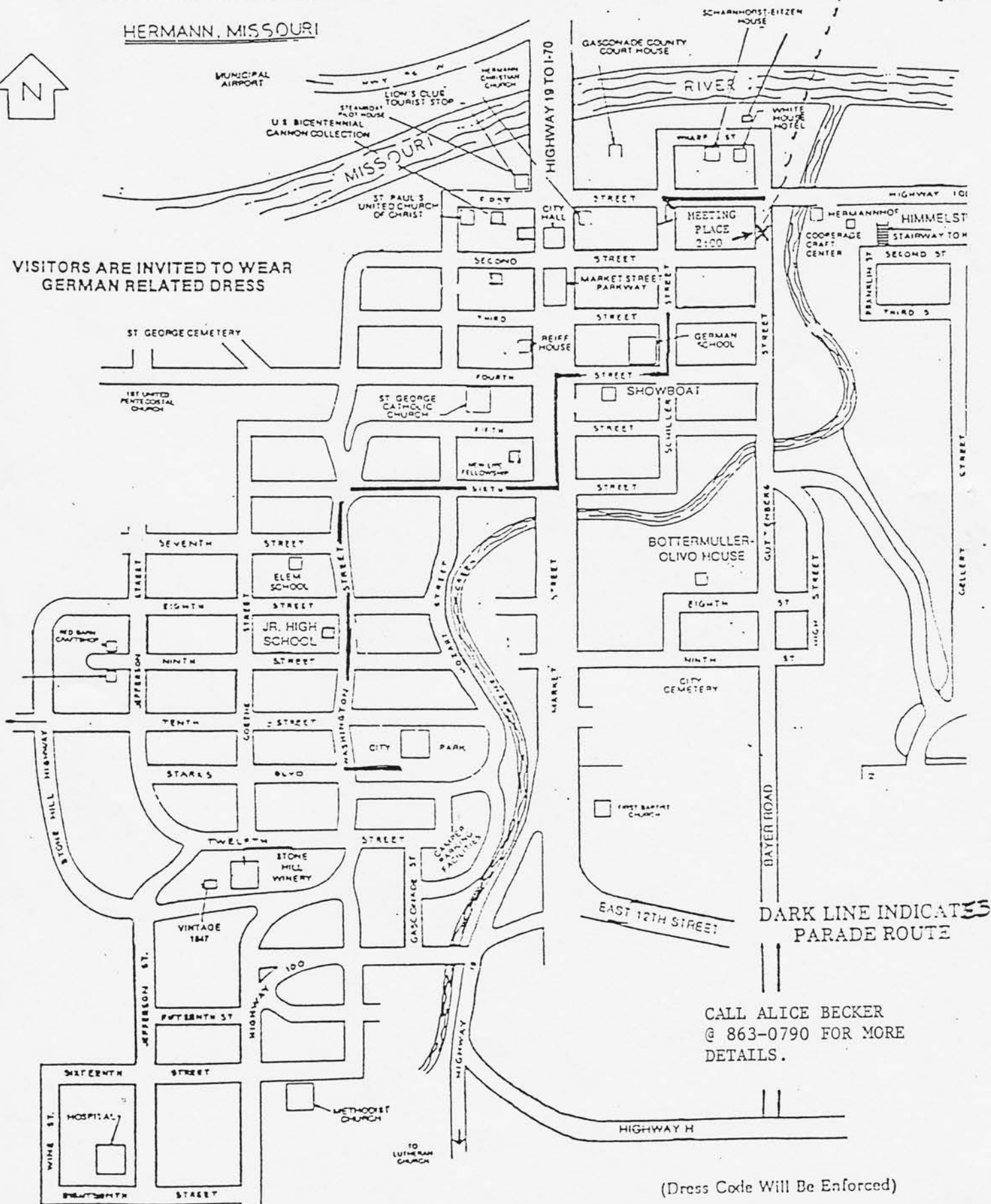
