SOME FACTS ABOUT VITAMINS

How well some animals cope with stress depends to a degree on their ability to produce pituitary and adrenal hormone. If the diet has been inadequate in protein, vitamin E or the B vitamins, B2, pantothenic acid, or cholin, sufficient pituitary hormones cannot be produced. Vitamin E, which is more concentrated in the pituitary gland than in any other part of the body, is thought to be particularly essential. It prevents both pituitary and adrenal hormones from being destroyed by oxygen.

A pantothenic acid deficiency causes the glands to shrivel and become filled with blood and dead cells, cortisone and other hormones can no longer be produced, and the many protective changes characteristic of stress do not occur. Even a slight lack of pantothenic acid causes a marked decrease in the quantity of hormones released. The pituitary, adrenal and sex hormones are all made from cholesterol, but without pantothenic acid cholesterol cannot be replaced in the glands after being used up. If generous amounts of pantothenic acid are given and the deficiency has not been severe, adrenal hormones can be produced normally, however a period of repair is necessary and recovery can be slow and uncertain.

A slight deficiency of linoleic acid or vitamins A, B2 or E can also limit hormone production and cause a degeneration of the adrenal cortex, each is as essential as pantothenic acid. Vitamin B2 given to animals previously deficient in it immediately promotes normal adrenal function. When oil supplying linoleic acid is given to rats lacking it, the production of adrenal hormones quickly increases almost 90 per cent.

Although adrenal hormones can be produced without vitamin C, the need for this nutrient is greatly increased by stress. Because large amounts of vitamin C are used to detoxify harmful substances formed in the body during stress, more than normal quantities are lost in the urine at this time. Huge amounts of vitamin C appear to protect animals from every form of stress. Huge quantity seems startling, but during severe stress it may not be excessive.

Animals undersupplied with vitamin E have abnormal EKG's and their hearts show degeneration of the muscles, massive scarring and accumulations of brown pigment characteristic of this vitamin deficiency. The same changes are found in persons with coronary disease and in autopsy studies of people who died from heart attacks. Vitamin E strengthens the heart muscles and its action is said to be similar to that of digitalis. While the vitamin is never toxic, at times it also acts as a diuretic, ridding the body of surplus water and decreasing high blood pressure by stimulating the output of pituitary hormones.

Arthritis has been produced in rats by injection of formaldehyde and in vitamin C-deficient guinea pigs by injecting of bacteria, both of which are forms of stress. The rats were protected if given massive amounts of vitamin E and the guinea pigs by vitamin C. Rats kept on a diet low in calcium and high in phosphorus have developed arthritis, which was corrected when twice as much calcium as phosphorus was given them. When animals are undersupplied with magnesium, calcium is laid down in the soft tissue, which is corrected soon after magnesium is given. In rats deficient in vitamin E, the calcium content of the soft tissue increases some 500 per cent. Both nutrients may be important in helping with osteoarthritis.

The Scientific Basis of Cynotechnique Formulations¹

The Royal Canin approach to the formulations of the Cynotechnique line of pet foods incorporate certain nutritional principles that make them unique among pet foods available on the American market.

Cynotechnique emphasizes the amounts and proportions of protein and fat, and the impact of protein and fat on the animal's activity and body condition, appearance and lifestyle.

For example, it is believed that excessive dietary fat will fatten a puppy, increasing the number of engorged fat cells and predisposing the puppy to remain fat and sluggish for the rest of its life.

Cynotechnique products contain relatively more protein and less fat than other premium and super-premium pet foods.

The nutrient requirements of dogs and cats have traditionally been expressed on a weight basis, eg, grams or milligrams of nutrient per kilogram of diet.

In 1985, the revision of the National Research Council's Nutrient Requirements of Dogs recommended minimum requirements of available nutrients (g,mg) per 1000 Kcal ME (calories of metabolizable energy). This innovation in national standards was a major theoretical advance, potentially bringing the regulations closer in theory to the scientific concept of balance in terms of energetic efficiency.

The 1985 NRC recommendations for dogs stated: "Food intake recommendations are based on energy content of the diet. It is therefore reasonable to conclude that nutrient content of foods should also be related to energy content of the food."

In practice, however, the 1985 NRC recommendation for dogs has not been accepted by the pet food industry. The industry in general continues to formulate its products on a weight basis.

Unlike the bulk of the American pet food industry, Royal Canin anticipated the 1985 NRC recommendations for dogs. Royal Canin Cynotechnique formulas have emphasized the protein-to-energy ratio and, indeed, the ratios of all essential nutrients to energy or calories. These ratios are all in the optimal ranges for the purposes specified for each product. Thus these products might be said to have CALORIC BALANCE.

Failure to use caloric balancing is the reason why super premium dog foods have too little protein to help a dog cope with stress. The protein content of most super premium dog food is a "high" looking number on the label, which is on a weight basis. But the fat content is also high on a weight basis, thus the caloric density is high and the protein is inadequate on a caloric basis. This is most pronounced for dogs subjected to² stress, for example, hard working dogs and old dogs.

Stress, according to Selye (1976)³, is the body's general set of responses to any increased demand, physical or emotional. These responses are mainly neural, hormonal and metabolic, with emphasis on an outpouring of cortisol from the adrenal gland. Prolonged or cumulative stress inhibits red blood cell production (causing anemia, lassitude and depression) and impairs immune mechanisms (increasing susceptibility to infectious diseases and certain cancers).

The caloric density of pet food is highly dependent upon the fat content of the food⁴. Fat itself has a caloric density of 9 Kcal/g, which is over twice that of carbohydrate or protein which is 4 Kcal/g.

Early experiments indicated that dogs, like most other animals, consume amounts of food sufficient to meet their energy needs⁵. Increase the caloric density, and the intake (by weight) will decrease so that the caloric intake remains the same. These old experiments are cited repeatedly without qualification. Unfortunately, however, they do not relate to today's highly palatable pet foods.

Fat not only raises the caloric density, which should reduce intake, but it also enhances palatability, which stimulates appetite and food intake. The palatability of commercial dog food increases in direct relation to their content of animal protein and animal fat.⁶

The high incidence of obesity in dogs and cats is attributable in part to pet foods high in fat and in palatability. Overweight pets are usually less physically active, creating positive feedback---a vicious cycle.

Cynotechnique formulations achieve desired, but not excessive degrees of palatability without emphasis on fat. Royal Canin has carefully selected the caloric density of each Cynotechnique product to meet its nutritional needs without contributing to any tendency for overweight or sluggishness.

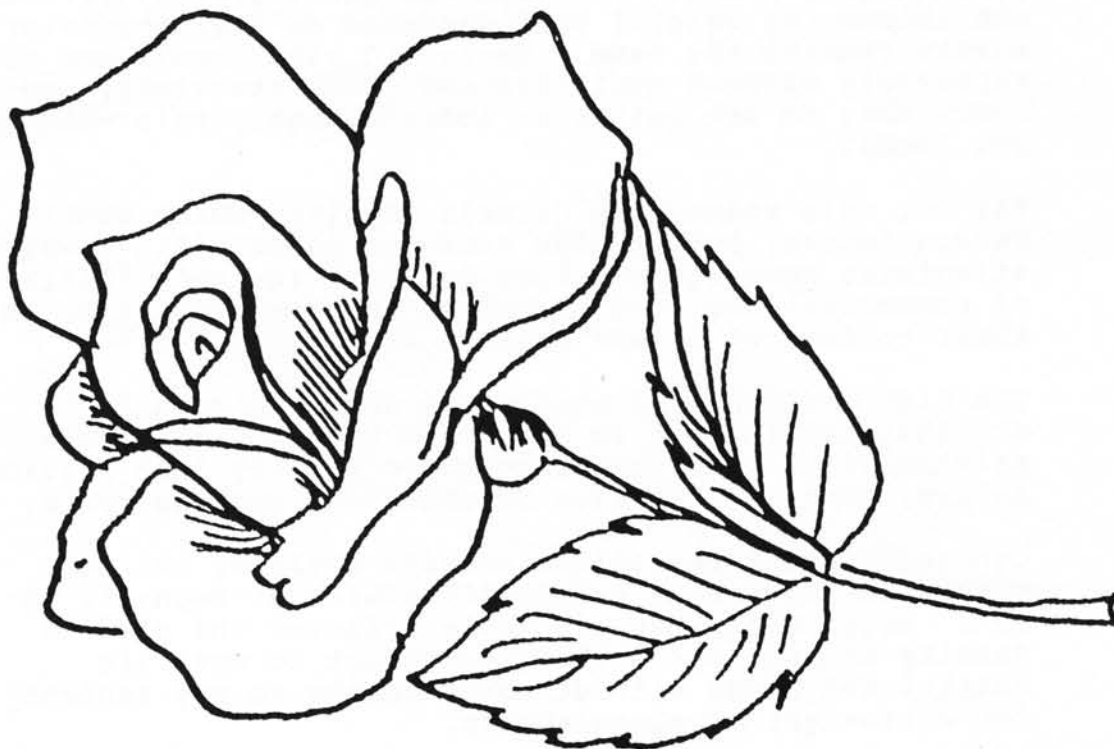

MEAT AND YOUR DOG

Most experts agree that dogs are carnivores by nature and that a well-balanced diet should include quality protein from meat sources besides cereals, vitamins, and minerals. But, lucky for us, we do not have to feed our dogs steak with their dinner to provide this animal protein; it can be found in a quality dry dog food. Quality is defined here as a dog food which has an animal source of protein in the first three ingredients.

Most labels on dog food packages are rather confusing. The first thing to remember is that the ingredients are listed by weight, that is, the heaviest (largest) amount of ingredient is listed first, and so on. Here are some definitions of the protein sources found in most dog foods:

MEAT - clean flesh from slaughtered mammals. Can only be applied to meat from cattle, pigs, sheep, and goats. Any other type, such as horsemeat, must be identified specifically.

MEAT BY PRODUCTS - lungs, spleen, kidneys, liver, and other organs. cannot include hair, horns, teeth, or hooves.

MEAT MEAL - dry rendered product from animal tissue

MEAT AND BONE MEAL - dry rendered product containing animal tissue and ground bone

POULTRY BY PRODUCTS - deboned poultry (usually chicken) parts and organs

FISH MEAL - dried fish that has had the oil removed. Has had all bones removed

SOY PRODUCTS - good source of vegetable protein, especially if used in quantities such that less than 20% of the protein is derived from the soy.

CORN GLUTEN MEAL - good source of vegetable protein. Left when the starch is removed from corn.

Protein percentages on dog food packages are not indications of the quality of the protein contained in the package. Nutritionists measure the quality of protein sources with a scale known as the "biological value". The lower the biological value, the more of the food that must be fed to meet the dog's requirements for protein. Whole egg is the perfect protein for a dog and has therefore been assigned the value of 100. Meat has a biological value between 80 and 90, and soy has a value of 68. As you can see, it would take more soy to feed a dog than meat. Protein sources with a biological value below 60 cannot meet a dog's need for protein no matter how much of it is fed.

Digestibility is the reason that dogs need meat protein. Dogs are physically equipped to kill, eat, and digest animals, or animal protein. The digestibility of a dog food is measured by comparing the stool volume with the volume of food eaten. You may not get a true idea of the digestibility of your dog food if it contains beet pulp as this will give you a dry, firm stool regardless of the other ingredients. High-cereal foods, such as soy-based foods, can cause the dog to pass several large stools a day. This is due to the large amount of indigestible matter that must be excreted by the dog, which can be hard on the dog's digestive system and a nuisance at kennel-cleaning time. Quality, meat-based foods are nutritionally concentrated because of the higher biological value of their protein sources and therefore the dog will pass fewer stools and they will have a firmer texture.

Price should not be a factor in the choice of a dog food unless you are choosing between equal or similar products. Compare the price of the dog food to its digestibility -- is it really less expensive to feed your dog the cheaper dog food if you must feed a larger quantity of the food, and spend more time cleaning kennels. If you add vitamin supplements and coat conditioners, the cost continues to rise. A good quality, concentrated dog food can be fed in a smaller quantity, many of the supplements and conditioners can be discarded, and less time will be spent cleaning. Decide for yourself.

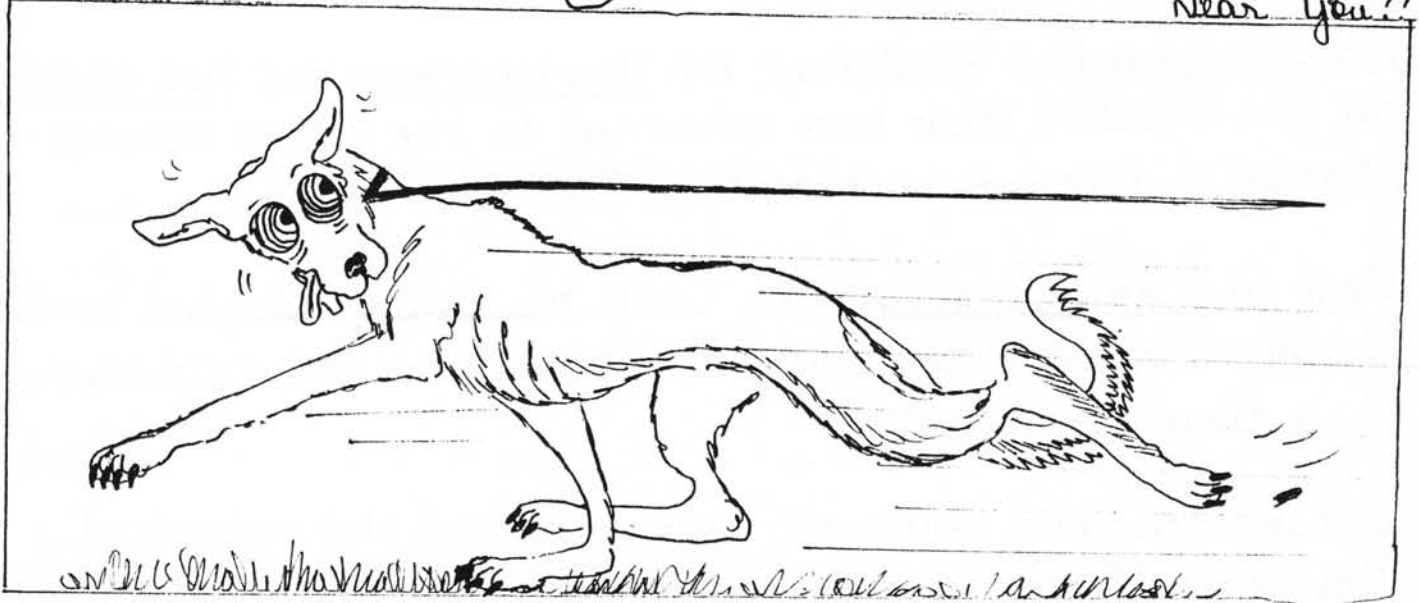

Puppy Mills' Foe Is Sure Bill Will Pass Eventually

State Rep. Pat Dougherty, D-St. Louis, says he is confident the Missouri Legislature eventually will pass a bill aimed at eliminating cruel and negligent "puppy mills."

"It's about time we do it, because of

the reputation Missouri has," he said. Dougherty has introduced a bill that would require state licensing and annual inspections of commercial breeders, kennels, pet shops and shelters that house dogs, cats and other animals.

The facilities would be required to provide adequate shelter, food, water

and a program of health and veterinary care. A violation would be a misdemeanor and could carry a fine. The annual \$200 licensing fees would go into an "animal care fund" that would pay for the regulatory program.

Dougherty said the license would be "an avenue or tool to try to come down on abusive and neglectful breeders that are basically ruining the industry and bringing unhealthy animals into the market. We've got a reputation around the nation that [is so poor] people don't want to buy from us anymore."

Last week, officials of two humane society organizations called for a Missouri state law to regulate dog breeders and kennels. The Humane Society of the United States called for a national boycott of puppy mills in

Missouri and five other states. Don Anthony, general manager of the Humane Society of Missouri, said Missouri was one of the biggest puppy-producing states.

Most commercial breeders are licensed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, which, some say, does not have enough staff or money for the work.

Dougherty's bill would require the state license, in addition to the federal license. Dougherty said he doubted the bill would pass in the two weeks remaining in this session, unless it is tacked on as an amendment to another bill.

"Barring that, we'll be spending the next few months to generate as much support as we can for the next legislative session," he said.
